ACQUISITION OF LANDS

The Government of Tamil Nadu having been satisfied that the lands specified in the Schedule below have to be acquired for a public purpose, and is having already been decided that the entire amount of compensation to be awarded for the lands is to be paid by the Postal Department, Government of India, out of the funds controlled and managed by Postal Department, the following Declaration is issued under Section 6 of the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 (Central Act I of 1894).

DECLARATION

Under Section 6 of the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 (Central Act I of 1894), the Governor of Tamil Nadu hereby declares that the lands Specified in the Schedule below and measuring 0.40.5 hectare, be the same, a little more or less are needed for a public purpose, to wit for the construction of New Building for the Head Post Office, Perambalur at Perambalur Taluk and District.

The plan of the lands is kept in the Office of the Revenue Divisional Officer, Perambalur and may be inspected at any time during office hours.

No. 7. Perambalur (South) Village.*

Government, dry, S.F. No. 145-3C, belongs to Ekambaram, son of Lakshmana Mudaliar, bounded on the North and east by S.F.No. 145-2C1, south by S.F.No. 146 and west by S.F.No. 145-1A—0.02.5 hectare.
